

Why You Should Check Your Passport's Expiration Date Right Now

Before you even think about booking that bucket-list vacation, there is one thing you need to do right now: Double check the expiration date on your passport.

It is vital to make sure your travel documents are valid for at least six months past the dates of any planned international trips. Since passports are valid for up to 10 years, it is understandably easy to forget when exactly it needs to be renewed (especially if you don't use it all that often). This seemingly small detail could result in a travel disaster.

While the U.S. allows travelers to use a passport until the exact date listed on the front page, that is not the case for many other countries. For example, if you want to check out the natural beauty of New Zealand, your passport needs to be

valid for another three months past your trip. Want to spend a week on the beach in Thailand? Six months. (You can check the <u>State Department's website</u> for the specific requirements for different countries.) Even though some countries have more lenient requirements, it is better to play it safe.

Here is how long it takes to renew a passport. If your passport's time is almost up, do not wait — start the process now. Passport processing times vary — currently, you can expect to wait between 10 to 12 weeks for routine processing and four to six weeks if you go the expedited route, according to the <u>State Department website</u>. You will have to pay an additional \$60 fee if you don't want to wait for routine processing. If you have an urgent situation (like a <u>life or death emergency</u>) that requires an immediate renewal for international travel within 72 hours, you can make an <u>in-person appointment</u>.

You can also pay extra for one- to two-day delivery, which means that your passport will be shipped to you within one to two days after it is printed.

Current Caribbean COVID-19 Rules, Regulations and Advisories

St. Lucia - All arrivals over age 5 must have a negative PCR test within seven days of arrival. You must also complete a travel authorization form and submit to screening, which includes temperature checks.

Punta Cana, Dominican Republic - No PCR test is required to enter the Dominican Republic. Between 3-10% of passengers will receive a quick, aleatory breath test, as will anyone displaying symptoms. You will also need to fill out a health affidavit upon arrival.

Jamaica - U.S. residents – along with several other countries – are required to submit a negative PCR or Antigen test within 10 days of travel to Jamaica.

Turks and Caicos - Travelers to Turks and Caicos must show a negative PCR test at most five days prior to arrival.

Bahamas - The Bahamas requires a negative PCR test within five days of traveling to the islands. Those staying beyond five days must get a rapid antigen test on day five of their visit.

Antigua - The Bahamas requires a negative PCR test within five days of traveling to the islands. Those staying beyond five days must get a rapid antigen test on day five of their visit.

According to the CDC, air passengers entering the U.S. will be required to present documentation of a negative COVID-19 viral test conducted within three days before their flight to the U.S. departs.

Documentation maybe paper or electronic and must include the name and contact information for the laboratory or healthcare personnel who performed the test.

Test results may be required to be shown again upon landing.

Most Caribbean and Mexico hotels have announced the inclusion of COVID-19 antigen testing on-property at no cost to guests traveling to the U.S., as accepted per CDC U.S. travel regulations beginning on January 26, 2021. On-site property testing will be administered by Hospiten, an international private hospital network committed to providing a first-rate health care service for travelers, across most destinations.

Test results will be received the same day in written format as required by the CDC. Guests should contact the concierge at each resort upon arrival to schedule departure testing.

For guests traveling to countries that do not accept the antigen test and require PCR testing, concierges at each resort will help coordinate and facilitate testing with off-property.

If a guest receives a positive test while on property that prevents departure, the cost of quarantine at the property will be covered for up to 14 days. Extended stay due to quarantine includes the guest plus one travel companion sharing the same room. This policy is valid for travel through March 31, 2021.



Royal Caribbean to Make Barbados Homeport Debut Later this Year

Royal Caribbean International on Wednesday announced that Grandeur of the Seas will sail some Southern Caribbean itineraries starting at the end of 2021.

While the Southern Caribbean is nothing new to Royal, the itineraries will mark the first time Royal Caribbean has homeported out of Barbados.

Grandeur will offer three different itineraries out of the Port of Bridgetown starting in December 2021—Grandeur will sail seven-night Southern Caribbean Explorer itineraries that call on Castries, Port of Spain, Scarborough, Kingstown, Roseau, and St. George's; seven-night ABC Caribbean Adventure itineraries that include calls at Kralendijk, Willemstad, Oranjestad, and Port of Spain; and a 14-night Ultimate Caribbean itineraries that includes calls at Colon and Puerto Limon.

American Airlines Launches Health Passport to Help Passengers with COVID Test Requirements

American Airlines this week announced that it would become the first U.S. airline to introduce a health passport for inbound travel to the United States, a move it says will help international travelers comply with the new Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) testing requirements.

American is making the VeriFLY app available for all of its passengers starting on Jan. 23. The app allows users to upload the requirement documentation, including proof of a negative COVID-19 test, they need to enter a destination.

VeriFLY is already using the app for inbound travelers to Jamaica, Chile, Colombia, El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras.

The test requirement for inbound international travelers was announced this week—on Tuesday, the CDC announced that starting on Jan. 26, all air passengers will have to get a viral test within three days of their flight to the U.S. and bring documentation of either the test (can be electronic) or documentation that they were infected and recovered, to their airline.

Airlines, according to the CDC rules, must then confirm the negative test for all passengers before boarding, and any passenger without the documentation must be denied boarding.

While American is the first airline to adopt the app for its passengers, <u>destinations and resorts in the Caribbean have already started adding COVID-19 testing on-site to accommodate U.S. guests.</u>
