

Lufthansa to Require Medical-Grade Masks on Flights

The airlines of the Lufthansa Group will require passengers to wear medical protective masks on flights to and from Germany from Feb. 1, according to the company. A surgical mask, FFP2 or KN95/N95 mask will be required on boarding, during the flight and when leaving the aircraft. Everyday masks no longer will be permitted.

A medical exemption from the obligation to wear a mask is only possible if the medical certificate is issued on a form provided by Lufthansa, and the passenger provides a negative Covid-19 test result obtained no earlier than 48 hours before the scheduled flight time.

The airline said, "In principle, infection on board is very unlikely. All Lufthansa Group aircraft are equipped with the highest quality air filters, which ensure air quality similar to that in an operating theatre. In addition, the air circulates vertically instead of being dispersed throughout the cabin."

American Sets Start Dates for Tel Aviv, Athens Flights

American Airlines' new service daily from New York's John F. Kennedy International Airport to both Tel Aviv and Athens will begin May 6 and June 2, respectively, the carrier announced. The flights, American's first new long-haul international service out of New York to be added in four years, will run year-round to Tel Aviv, and the seasonal Athens service runs through Oct. 30. The flights will build on the carrier's recently approvedNortheastern United States alliance with JetBlue.

Las Vegas says good bye!

Illusionist Siegfried Fischbacher, 81, a longtime box office presence with his partner, Roy Horn, died Jan. 13 of pan-

creatic cancer.



Fischbacher, will be remembered for his role in one of the most spectacular shows in the history of the Strip. Siegfried & Roy, a presence in Las Vegas since the late 1960s, attained their commercial and artistic pinnacle at the Mirage from 1990 to 2003. In 2001, it was estimated that they had performed 5,000 shows at the casino for 10 million fans and had grossed more than \$1 billion. When their show ended after a tiger attacked Horn onstage, the theater was converted to house Cirque du Soleil's "The Beatles Love."

The duo astonished audiences during their lavish shows. Their magic often

incorporated white tigers, elephants and snakes and was augmented by smoke machines, lasers and sequined costumes. Their influence on Las Vegas' entertainment will endure

They gained international attention for helping to save rare white tigers and white lions from extinction; Siegfried & Roy's Secret Garden and Dolphin Habitat continues at the Mirage. The road that stretches from the Strip to the Mirage was renamed Siegfried & Roy Drive in August.

Excluded from New CDC Travel Requirement, Puerto Rico is Uniquely Positioned to Welcome U.S. Travelers

For those who want to get away to a sun and sand destination, Puerto Rico presents a unique opportunity to experience the Caribbean atmosphere without the hassle of having to meet the CDC's new international travel requirement.

Starting Tuesday, inbound U.S. travelers will need to have proof of a negative COVID-19 test taken within three days prior to re-entry.

Given that Puerto Rico is a U.S. territory, the destination is excluded from the CDC requirement and Americans do not need to provide a negative COVID-19 test result to return back to the mainland United States. All trips to and from Puerto Rico are considered domestic travel, which may alleviate any concerns of those who wish to travel in the upcoming months.

However, the CDC still recommends getting tested three to five days after arrival and staying home for seven days post-travel.



- Preheat the oven to 300 degrees F. Lightly butter a 9-by-13-inch casserole dies.

- 5 To assemble the casserole: Preheat the oven to 380 degrees F. Spread the coconut almond mixture evenly over the soaked bread sites. Top with the remaining 1/4 cup allead almonds and 3 tablespoons occurred and bake until puffed and lightly golden and the custard is set (the center of the casserole will no longer jaggle when shaken), 45 to 50 minutes. Allow to cool for 1 hour before serving, or serve at room temperature.

These European Cruises Plan to Resume Sailing This Month

MSC and Costa were two of the first cruise lines to bring back cruises over the summer, before putting fall cruises on hold due to a second wave of COVID-19.

European cruise lines MSC Cruises and Costa Cruises announced their plans to resume voyages around the continent later this month.

MSC Cruises plans to resume cruises from the port of Genoa, Italy on Jan. 24, with weekly cruises of the western Mediterranean aboard the *MSC Grandiosa*. The cruise line originally intended on bringing back ships earlier in the month, but the Italian government has blocked port access until Jan. 15, reps for the company said in a statement. On Feb. 14, the *MSC Magnifica* will also return to sea, with 11-night cruises of Italy, Greece, and Malta. The relaunch of that ship was also pushed back, due to restrictions by the Greek government.

Costa Cruises plans to resume its cruises on Jan. 31 onboard the *Costa Deliziosa*. Travelers will be able to book three, four, and seven-day itineraries to Italian ports.

MSC and Costa were two of the first cruise lines to bring back cruises over the summer, with Mediterranean voyages in August and September. Passengers aboard the summer cruises were required to board the ship in staggered groups, maintain social distancing on board, and undergo a COVID-19 swab test.

When a second wave of COVID-19 hit in the autumn, the cruise lines began cancelling itineraries in November and through the holiday season.
