Shrimp and Andouille Etouffee

Serves 4-6 people

Ingredients:

6 ounces butter unsalted, ½ cup flour, 2 cups onion (minced),1 cup green bell pepper (minced), 1 cup celery (minced), 2 table-spoons garlic (minced finely), 8 ounces tomato (canned/diced),2 bay leaves, 1 teaspoon of salt, 1 teaspoon cayenne pep-per, 1 tablespoon creole seasoning, 1 quart shrimp stock, 2 pounds 21/25 shrimp, peeled and deveined with tail shell off, 1 pound.

Directions: 1. Melt butter in pan set over medium heat. **2**. Add the flour and stir continuously to make roux. Stir the roux over medium heat until the color of peanut butter, 5 to 7 mins. Add the onions, bell pepper, celery, and garlic to the roux and cook stirring often, for 10 mins. **3**. Add the tomatoes to the pot and season with the bay leaves, salt, cayenne and ½ tablespoon or creole seasoning. **4**. Cook the tomatoes for 2 to 3 minutes and then whisk in the shrimp stock **5**. Bring the mixture to a boil and reduce to simmer. **6**. Cook the Etoufee on low heat, stirring occasionally for 45 minutes. **7**. Season the shrimp and Andouille with the remaining ½ tablespoon of creole seasoning and add them to the pot, stirring to evenly distribute. **8**. Cook the shrimp for 5 to 7 minutes, or until they are cooked through. **9**. Finish by adding the chopped parsley to the pot and stir and serve over rice

Status: Open for travel with restrictions.

COVID-19 test entry requirement: The Government of Aruba requires all visitors to undergo a Molecular SARS-CoV-2 test based on a nasal or oral swab within 72 hours before entering Aruba. Children aged 14 and under are exempt.

Other entry requirements: All visitors are required to complete an online Embarkation/Disembarkation card and be approved in order to gain entry to Aruba, face masks are required at the airport. Aruba Visitors Insurance is a mandatory insurance that helps protect visitors against incurred medical and non-medical expenses if testing positive for COVID-19 during their stay in Aruba. Status: Open for travel with restrictions. All incoming travelers are subject to a 14-day mandatory quarantine upon arrival. Quarantine opt-out is possible if travelers present proof of a negative COVID-19 test.

COVID-19 test entry requirement: Beginning October 15, all travelers aged five (5) and over are now required to take a Nucleic Acid Amplification Test (NAAT) from a certified Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendment (CLIA) lab in order to bypass the State of Hawai'i's 14-day mandatory quarantine. The State of Hawai'i will accept test results ONLY from Trusted Testing and Travel Partners. The test will need to be taken no more than 72 hours before your flight departure time.

Other entry requirements: Face mask and social distancing is required throughout the Hawaiian islands including all airports, passenger temperatures are checked via thermal screening, and travelers must complete a health & travel questionnaire before arrival.

CLIA Calls for CDC to Lift Framework for Conditional Sailing From US Ports

Cruise Lines International Association (CLIA), which represents 95 percent of global ocean-going cruise capacity, called on the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to lift the Framework for Conditional Sailing Order (CSO) and allow for the planning of a phased resumption of cruise operations from U.S. ports by the beginning of July. The early-July timeframe is in line with President Biden's forecast for when the United States will be "closer to normal."

Over the past eight months, a highly-controlled resumption of cruising has continued in Europe, Asia, and the South Pacific—with nearly 400,000 passengers sailing to date in more than 10 major cruise markets. These voyages were successfully completed with industry-leading protocols that have effectively mitigated the spread of COVID-19. Additional sailings are planned in the Mediterranean and Caribbean later this spring and summer.

According to CLIA, the very small fraction of reported COVID cases (fewer than 50 based on public reports) is dramatically lower than the rate on land or in any other transportation mode. This is a testament to the industry's unparalleled expertise, gained over more than half a century, in coordinating movements of guests and crew, efficiently organizing complex embarkations and excursions, and designing vessels that are more technologically advanced and operationally agile than any other mode of transportation.

Following the cruise industry's voluntary suspension of operations last March, cruise lines have been prevented from operating in the U.S. by a series of "No Sail Orders" issued by the CDC. The CSO was issued last October, but since then the CDC has not released any further guidance, as called for in the order, to support the resumption of U.S. cruise operations. The lack of any action by the CDC has effectively prevented all sailings in the largest cruise market in the world. Cruising is the only sector of the U.S. economy that remains prohibited, even as most others have opened or continued to operate throughout the pandemic.

The outdated CSO, which was issued almost five months ago, does not reflect the industry's proven advancements and success operating in other parts of the world, nor the advent of vaccines, and unfairly treats cruises differently. Cruise lines should be treated the same as other travel, tourism, hospitality, and entertainment sectors.

According to CLIA, restarting cruises as part of the broader travel industry recovery will provide a much-needed boost to the U.S. economy—with the cruise industry supporting nearly 450,000 American jobs and contributing over \$55.5 billion annually, prior to the pandemic. Based on economic modeling by research firm BREA, more than 300,000 jobs have been lost in the United States due to the suspension of cruises.

So what's the CDC's reaction to requests by CLIA and ASTA to have the CSO lifted? Initially, it appears the CDC is remaining firm on not changing it until the Nov. 1, 2021. One report said the CDC says the current framework for resuming cruising will remain in place, though another report says it is working to update the order. Returning to passenger cruising is a phased approach to mitigate the risk of spreading COVID-19, the CDC told one media outlet. Details for the next phase of the CSO are currently under interagency review.
