# U.S. Passports Will Soon Get More Expensive

On December 20, the State Department announced that the cost of passport books will increase by \$20. The price hike applies to all customers, and it will take effect starting December 27.

The \$20 bump specifically applies to the security surcharge fees associated with passports. According to the State Department's <u>Twitter account</u>, "The increased fee is necessary to ensure we continue to produce one of the most secure travel and identity documents in the world."

So how exactly will that extra money be used? Back in 2006, a slew of new features were added to passports, including polycarbonate coating over pages, raised lettering and watermarks, and RFID chips. The surcharges help pay for all those features, therein better protecting travelers from identity theft and fraud



You can find the current passport book prices on the State Department's website, but this is what you can expect to pay in fees beginning next week:

- If you're an adult (16 and older) and applying for the first time: \$165
- If you're an adult (16 and older) and renewing your passport: \$130
- If your child is under 16 and you're applying for their passport: \$135

There are also special fees for rush orders, including \$60 for expedited service and \$17.56 for one-to-two-day delivery. Those fees will not be affected by the upcoming price increases.

This news comes just one week after President Biden signed an executive order to switch mail-in passport renewals to an online system, though we don't know exactly when that change will take place. Right now, the process involves filling out forms, printing them out, and mailing them (along with your expired passport) to a designated center.

## Update: Spain Will Require Booster Shots for Vaccinations Older than 270 Days

Starting **February 1st**, U.S. travelers visiting Spain must be fully vaccinated and must have received the last required dose of their COVID vaccine **no less than 14 days and <u>no more than 270 days</u> prior to arrival** in Spain. If more than 270 days have passed since the last required dose, travelers must show proof of having received a booster shot at least 14 days prior to arrival.

Spain accepts those vaccines approved by the World Health Organization, namely: Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, Astra-Zeneca, Johnson & Johnson, Sinovac, and Sinopharm.

## Go-With-Anything Baked Chicken Meatballs



#### Directions:

Position the rack in the top third of the oven and preheat the oven to 425 degrees F. Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment.

2 Stir together the ground chicken, breadcrumbs, milk, Parmesan, parsley, ricotta, Italian seasoning, 1 1/4 teaspoons of salt and several grinds of pepper in a large bowl until evenly combined.

Roll the mixture into 16 meatballs (about 3 tablespoons each). Transfer to the prepared baking sheet and lightly spray with cooking spray. Bake until the meatballs are golden brown and cooked through (the internal temperature should be 165 degrees F on an instant-read thermometer), 22 to 25 minutes.

1 pound ground chicken

2/3 cup plain breadcrumbs

1/4 cup whole milk

1/4 cup finely grated Parmesan (about 2 ounces)

1/4 cup lightly packed fresh parsley, finely chopped (about 2 tablespoons)

1/4 cup whole milk ricotta

2 teaspoons dried Italian seasoning

1 large egg, lightly beaten

Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

Olive oil cooking spray
