

INGREDIENTS

1.5 lb Cod fillet pieces, 4-6 pieces ¼ cup chopped fresh parsley leaves

LEMON SAUCE

- 5 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 5 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tablespoon melted butter
- 5 garlic cloves, minced

FOR COATING

⅓ cup all purpose flour

I teaspoon ground coriander

¾ teaspoon sweet Spanish paprika

¾ teaspoon ground cumin

¾ teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon black pepper

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to 400F.

Mix together the lemon juice, olive oil, and melted butter in a shallow bowl (do not add the garlic yet). Set aside.

In another shallow bowl, mix the all-purpose flour, spices, salt, and pepper. Set next to the lemon sauce.

Pat the fish dry. Dip the fish in the lemon sauce then dip it in the flour mixture. Shake off excess flour.

Heat 2 tablespoon olive oil in a cast iron skillet (or an oven-safe pan) over medium-high heat (watch the oil to be sure it is

shimmering but not smoking). Add the fish and sear on each side to give it some color, but do not fully cook (about 2 minutes on each side). Remove the skillet from heat.

To the remaining lemon sauce, add the minced garlic and mix. Drizzle all over the fish fillets.

Bake in the heated oven until the fish flakes easily with a fork (check at 7 minutes but should be ready by 10 minutes.

Remove from the heat and sprinkle chopped parsley. Serve immediately.

Hawai'i Asks Visitors to Postpone Maui Travel Amid Wildfires

Nonessential travel to Maui is being strongly discouraged as Maui and the Big Island battle severe blazes.

As firefighters battled deadly blazes in Maui and as recovery efforts are underway, Hawai'i's tourism officials are asking visitors who were scheduled to travel to west Maui, which has seen the brunt of the burning, to put off their plans for a bit.

The state of Hawai'i issued an emergency proclamation on Wednesday that also strongly discouraged any nonessential travel to Maui amid ongoing evacuations and rescue efforts. As of Thursday morning, the Associated Press reported that the Maui wildfires had killed 36 people, making this the deadliest U.S. blaze since the 2018 Camp Fire in Northern California.

Officials note the fires have burned hundreds of acres and forced school and road closures, as well as evacuations in the Kohala Ranch area of Hawai'i and the Kula and Lāhainā areas of Maui. The wildfires were brought on by dry conditions and strong winds caused by Hurricane Dora, which passed through the southern portion of the state on Tuesday.

"Travel to the rest of the Hawaiian Islands, including Kaua'i, O'ahu, Moloka'i, Lāna'i, and other parts of Hawai'i Island, is currently unaffected," the Hawai'i Tourism Authority stated. Kahului Airport (OGG) on Maui remains open, according to Hawai'i's Department of Transportation, but the airport has been sheltering evacuees and thousands of travelers stranded by canceled flights.

In light of the wildfires and devastation, all of the major U.S. airlines have issued travel waivers.

For travelers witnessing the tragedy from afar and wondering how they can help, several organizations have jumped in to provide aid and assistance. They include Maui United Way, Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement and the Maui Food Bank.





The World's Coolest Underground Attractions

Paris Catacombs

The remains of more than 6 million bodies lie in the labyrinth of the Paris Catacombs 20 meters beneath the city's streets. The city's overrun cemeteries in the 18th century led the government to begin moving the dead to underground locations, inadvertently creating a spooky spot that has been attracting tourists for generations.






Wieliczka Salt Mine

The Wieliczka Salt Mine, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, was one of the oldest salt mines in operation until it ceased production in 2007. Hand-carved caves and brine lakes mark the fascinating trip 500 feet beneath the medieval town of Wieliczka. Just a half-day trip from Krakow, tours of the mine dive deeper into its history, where you can marvel at the ornate chapel of the Blessed Kinga, whose intricate details are made from salt deposits.

Salina Turda

A 4.5 hour trip from Bucharest, the Salina Turda—known as the largest salt mine in the world—has been transformed into a subterranean amusement park 368 feet (120 meters) underground. The depths for entertainment and relaxation are limitless: an underground lake for boating, a halotherapy spa, and even a bowling alley.







Churchill War Rooms

Five caves house the highlights of this UNESCO World Heritage Site, including a 100-foot-tall Buddha gilded in gold at its entrance; mural paintings encompassing the cave walls, and more than 150 statues honoring Buddha, gods, goddesses, and royalty.

Crystal & Fantasy Caves
