

U.S. to Invest \$6 Billion on West Coast High-Speed Train Line



The U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) has made decisions that will start construction of a 186-plus mph train line between Las Vegas and Los Angeles and to continue building California's high-speed line. FRA grants will also advance the development of other new passenger-train service nationwide.

Under the 2021 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law's Federal-State Partnership Program (FSP), the FRA is awarding more than \$6 billion in funding specifically for high-speed rail includes \$3 billion for Brightline West's high-speed line between Las Vegas and L.A., planned to open by 2028. It also includes \$3 billion for the continuation of design and construction for California's high-speed rail line.

Through a second program called Corridor ID, the FRA is also expected to award dozens of grants of \$500,000 each, to study new and improved passenger-train lines throughout the country. Elected officials with knowledge of the FRA's decisions have begun sharing some of the funded projects.

The railroad Brightline, which already operates successful trains between Miami and Orlando, aims to launch 186-plus mph passenger service between Las Vegas and Los Angeles in time for the 2028 Olympics. California and Nevada have already granted Brightline a right of way alongside Interstate 15, and federal funding now allows the project to break ground. The California High Speed Rail Authority, additionally, received FSP support for the 200-mph high-speed line that it already has under construction in California's Central Valley, as well as sections that will connect to Silicon Valley, the Bay Area and Los Angeles transit systems.

As examples of other projects to be funded, U.S. Senator Sherrod Brown of Ohio has shared four routes to receive federal support: Cleveland-Columbus-Dayton-Cincinnati, Cleveland-Toledo-Detroit, Chicago-Fort Wayne-Columbus-Pittsburgh, and additional Cardinal Service through Ohio, between Chicago and the east coast.

Ingredients:

Chicken:

- 1 large chicken breast or 2 small chicken breasts (see Cook's Note)
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon olive oil

Alfredo Sauce:

- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 6 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 cups milk
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 3 cups shredded Parmesan
- 9 oven-ready lasagna noodles
- 1/2 cup chopped fresh parsley, plus additional for garnish
- 12 ources shredded mozzarella

Directions:

- 1 For the chicken: Preheat the oven to 350 degr
- Sprinkle the chicken breast with the Italian se salt and pepper. Heat the oil in a pan and coo chicken on medium heat until it registers 165 de the middle, about 5 minutes on each side. Cube
- 3 For the alfredo sauce: In the same pan that the over low heat. Add the minced garlic and cookminutes. Add the flour and whisk until smooth. Alaska Airlines to Acquire Hawaiian Airlines for \$1.9 Billion

Alaska Airlines, the fifth largest airline in North America, announced on Sunday that it had agreed to acquire Hawaiian Airlines for \$1.9 billion.

While approved by both Hawaiian and Alaska boards, the deal still needs to be approved by regulatory boards and Hawaiian Holdings, the carrier's holding company, shareholders. The deal is expected to close in 12 to 18 months.



If fully approved, the deal will create a combined airline that serves close to 55 million passengers annually, keeping the new Alaska as the fifth largest North American airline by passengers carried behind Delta, American, Southwest, and United. It will create a combined fleet of 365 narrow and wide-body aircraft, and a combined network of 138 destinations, not including destinations served via Alaska's oneworld Alliance.

More uniquely, the deal brings together two carriers that grew out of a need to connect residents of two noncontiguous states to the continental U.S.

Alaska plans to preserve the Hawaiian brand and continue to operate it separately from Alaska. The new Alaska will remain headquartered in Seattle while creating a hub for Alaska Airlines in Honolulu.

Plans also call for Alaska to add more international connections for West Coast travelers to the Asia-Pacific region with one-stop service from Hawaii.

There's no word yet on the outlook for regulatory approval. Some recent mergers and acquisitions, including JetBlue's acquisition of Spirit, have caught the ire of governmental regulations. Still, Alaska was optimistic of the 12 to 18 months timeframe in the announcement on Sunday.
