The Iconic Boeing 747 Ends Its 50-Year Run



The Boeing 747 jetliner, the bulbous-nosed behemoth that effectively kicked off the era of mass tourism, has left the building.

But the ending, when it came, was a bit anticlimactic. Boeing hadn't produced a passenger version of the widebody in several years, and the last model that rolled off the assembly line in Seattle earlier this month was a freighter version built for cargo line Atlas Air.

Out of a total of 1,574 747s built over its lifetime, just around 100 are still in service. Most airlines had retired their 747 fleets in favor of a new generation of long-haul aircraft, which carry fewer people than the 450-passenger giant, and, with just two engines versus the 747's four, burn less fuel.

Still, few airplanes have ever generated the kind of excitement that the 747 did when it debuted in 1970. It was, after all, the world's first widebody passenger aircraft, and international travelers accustomed to the cramped confines of planes like the single-aisle 707 were wowed.

Some airlines have stoked the nostalgia factor even as they were parking their own 747s. Take United, which once had a sizable fleet of the jumbos that it acquired from Pan Am, the original launch customer for the plane. In announcing the plane's retirement in 2017, United promoted a farewell tour, along with commemorative souvenirs and amenities kits.

The fact that the aircraft entered service on storied, but now defunct, carriers like Pan Am, TWA, and Braniff, also plays into the notion of it as a symbol of the supposed "golden age of air travel," as opposed to the crowded planes and flight disruptions most of us associate with air travel these days.


Holland America Line's (HAL) latest pricing announcement reveals it to be the latest of multiple major cruise lines to raise its gratuity fees in early 2023.

In fairness, HAL's newly announced price hike is only an increase of 50 cents for both suite and non-suite staterooms, bringing the charge up to \$17.50 and \$16.00, respectively. The change in its 'Crew Appreciation' charge amount is set to take effect on February 1, 2023.

Crew appreciation charges are automatically applied to each guest's onboard account at a fixed daily rate through the end of their voyage. In one sense, it's certainly convenient for customers, taking the time and confusion out of tipping the various staff members who serve them throughout their stay.

Crew appreciation—as well as service charges applied to the products, services and amenities not included in a guest's cruise fare—are collected from all guests aboard every cruise, and pooled funds are distributed to both customer-facing crew members and those who work behind the scenes, "to recognize the efforts of a wide variety of crewmembers who contribute to the experiences of all our guests," HAL explained in its notice.

the adjustment to cruise lines' daily gratuity charges isn't the only recent increase in cruise costs, and that price hikes are also being applied to other onboard items, such as Wi-Fi and beverage packages, as well as at non-inclusive dining options.

Almost-Famous Broccoli Cheddar Soup

The bakery-café chain Panera Bread is famous for its bread bowls, but insiders know that the real treat is the stuff inside. The company's broccoli-cheddar soup practically has a cult following, which explains why Betty Ling from Arcadia, CA, and other readers keep writing to us for the recipe. Spokespeople at Panera's Missouri head-quarters wouldn't tell us how they make the extra-creamy soup, but they did confirm that it's a bestseller: Their stores ladle out more than 50 million cups of it every year, blowing through five million heads of broccoli in the process. Chefs in Food Network Kitchens went through their own big batch of broccoli to nail down this perfect imitation.



Ingredients:

- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cups half-and-half
- 3 cups low-sodium chicken bro
- 2 bay leaves
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper
- 4 7 -inch sourdough bread boules (round loaves)
- 4 cups broccoli florets (about 1 head)
- 1 large carrot, diced
- 2 1/2 cups (about 8 ounces) grated sharp white and yellow cheddar cheese, plus more for garnish

Directions:

- 1 Melt the butter in a large Dutch oven or pot over medium heat. Add the onion and cook until tender, about 5 minutes. Whisk in the flour and cook until golden. 3 to 4 minutes, then gradually whisk in the half-and-half until smooth. Add the chicken broth, bay leaves and nutmeg, then season with salt and pepper and bring to a simmer. Reduce the heat to medium-low and cook, uncovered, until thickened, about 20 minutes.
- Meanwhile, prepare the bread bowls: Using a sharp knife, cut a circle into the top of each loaf, leaving a 1-inch border all around. Remove the bread top, then hollow out the middle with a fork or your fingers, leaving a thick bread shell.

- Add the broccoli and carrot to the broth mixture and simmer until tender, about 20 minutes. Discard the bay leaves. Puree the soup in batches in a blender until smooth; you'll still have flecks of carrot and broccoli. Return to the pot. (Or puree the soup in the pot with an immersion blender.)
- 4. Add the cheese to the soup and whisk over medium heat until melted. Add up to 3/4 cup water if the soup is too thick. Ladle into the bread bowls and garnish with cheese.
