The Euro Is at \$1.05—the Lowest It's Been in Years

The strong dollar trend doesn't appear to be reversing anytime soon, making travel to Europe from the U.S. that much more affordable right now.

If the euro actually reaches parity against the dollar, it will be the first time in two decades that one U.S. dollar will be the equivalent value of one euro. The U.S. Dollar Index, which tracks the value of the dollar against other currencies, is at its highest level in 20 years. Currency forecasting is challenging given all the complex (and often rather volatile) global economic factors that are in play, but Bloomberg reported on May 10 that financial planners and economists are currently confident that the U.S. dollar will continue to rally.

Whether or not the currencies hit parity, the fact that they are already this close should serve as welcome relief for Americans heading to Europe in the coming days and weeks, helping to offset the costs of skyrocketing airfares (which have been pushed up by a rise in oil prices and staffing shortages as airlines race to keep up with the rapid rise in demand for travel).

The strong dollar news comes as international travel is experiencing a robust rebound after two years of being stunted by the global coronavirus pandemic. U.S. travelers have indicated that they are more than ready to return to Europe regardless of the airfares and the exchange rate. Luxury travel consultancy Zicasso reported that compared to the first quarter of 2021, summer travel bookings for 2022 are currently up 500 percent, with Europe trips constituting 80 percent of those bookings.

But for some travelers who have been considering crossing the pond this year and have not yet committed, the strong dollar could present just the push they need go ahead to take the leap.

European Union Will Drop Its Mask Mandate for Travel Next Week

The EU Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) and European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) made the announcement on Tuesday, dropping the recommendation of mandatory mask-wearing in airports and on board flights starting on May 16, 2022.

While the agencies said that wearing a mask "is still one of the best protections against the transmission of COVID-19," it will no longer push for the practice to be a requirement during travel.

Rules for masks, in particular, will continue to vary by airline beyond that date because of other entry rules, including flights to a destination outside of the EU where mask-wearing is still required.

Celebrity Cruises Selects Simone Biles as Godmother of Celebrity Beyond




Simone Biles, 19time World Champion and seven-time



Ingredients:

Marinated strawberries:

1 quart fresh strawberries, halved 1/3 cup aged balsamic vinegar

Whipped cream:

3 cups heavy cream 2 teaspoons vanilla extract 1/4 cup confectioners' sugar

Trifle:

(1 pound) fresh pound cake
 1/3 cup amaretto liqueur
 2 amaretto cookies, for garnish
 Demerara sugar, for garnish



Individual Strawberry Trifles

Directions:

- 1 For the marinated strawberries: In a small, shallow casserole dish, toss the strawberries with the vinegar and let stand at room temperature for 15 to 20 minutes. After the strawberries have marinated, check for sweetness, adding sugar if desired.
- For the whipped cream: In a large bowl, using an electric mixer, whisk the cream to soft peaks. Add the vanilla and confectioners' sugar. Whip to stiff peaks. Set aside.
- For the trifle: Using a serrated knife, slice the pound cake lengthwise into 1/2-inch-thick slices. You will only need four slices. Using a 2-inch cookie cutter, cut out circles from each cake slice. Line up two highball glasses and place one cake circle in the bottom of each. Brush the cakes with amaretto liqueur. Add 2 tablespoons of marinated strawberries and spread evenly. Using a different tablespoon, add a large dollop of whipped cream and spread evenly.

Add a second layer of cake, pressing down lightly. Brush with amaretto liqueur. Add 2 tablespoons of marinated strawberries and spread evenly. Top with a large dollap of whipped cream, spreading evenly. Use the remaining cake, cream and strawberries to create a more humble trifle dish.

- Cover the trifles with plastic wrapand refrigerate for impromptuindulgence, keeping in mind that it will store for up to 2 days.
- 5 To serve, remove and discard the plastic wrap. Grate some amaretto cookie on top of the trifles and sprinkle with Demerara sugar.



New High-Speed Train Routes Are Coming to Europe

It's about to get easier and faster to move across western Europe and the United Kingdom by train, thanks to the merger of two major railway operators, Eurostar and Thalys.

Currently, the London-based <u>Eurostar</u> shuttles passengers from London's St. Pancras station across the Channel Tunnel to several French cities (including Paris, Calais, Lille, and Lyon), as well as Brussels, Belgium, and Rotterdam and Amsterdam in the Netherlands. Meanwhile, Belgian rail network <u>Thalys</u> serves destinations in France, the Netherlands, Germany, and Belgium.

While the two companies do overlap, with each already operating some routes in France, the Netherlands, and Belgium, they largely serve different cities within those countries. Additionally, Thalys doesn't currently operate in the U.K., and Eurostar doesn't have any trains in Germany.

While it is not yet clear when the merger will go into full effect, when it does, it will mean travelers can move throughout the five countries—the U.K., France, the Netherlands, Germany, and Belgium—on a single ticket. Other benefits include more departure times and a shared loyalty program.
