NORWEGIAN CRUISE LINE® ANNOUNCES PORT OF PHILADELPHIA AS A NEW HOMEPORT WITH ITS 2026 SPRING/SUMMER SEASON

-The Company Will Be the First to Commence Cruising in Philadelphia with Voyages to Bermuda, as well as Canada and New England Beginning April 16, 2026-

-The Company Also Unveils Nearly 250 New 2026 Spring/Summer Voyages to the Caribbean, Bahamas and Alaska From Nine Major Cruise Ports Across the U.S. and Canada, Including Miami, Seattle, New York City and Quebec City, Among Others-

Norwegian Cruise Line (NCL), the innovator in global cruise travel with a 57-year history of breaking boundaries, today announced its 2026 spring/summer itineraries to the Caribbean, Bahamas, Bermuda, Alaska, and Canada and New England, as well as a new season of voyages from the Port of Philadelphia (PhilaPort) for the first time in many years.

On April 16, 2026, Norwegian Jewel® will commence seven-to-nine-day cruises to Bermuda, launching the city as a new cruise destination. Departing from the SouthPort Marine Terminal Complex, where plans are currently underway with the local government to develop a facility to welcome cruisers in 2026, Norwegian Jewel's Bermuda itineraries will feature overnight calls to Royal Naval Dockyard, Bermuda, providing guests more time to enjoy and discover the island's turquoise blue waters and pink-sand beaches. This new homeport for NCL will provide residents in the U.S. Mid-Atlantic region more access to cruising, as it will be the only cruise line sailing from Philadelphia through Oct. 17, 2026.

The Company's new 2026 spring/summer season includes nearly 250 itineraries for nine of its soon-to-be 20 ships. Embarking from U.S. and Canadian ports between April and November 2026, these voyages will call to 30 unique destinations across the Caribbean, Bermuda, Bahamas, Canada and New England, as well as Alaska. With an average of 10 hours in port, guests can choose to enjoy the picture-perfect beaches, colorful cities and vibrant culture of the Caribbean, Bahamas and Bermuda; enjoy the rustic fall foliage of Canada and New England; or dive deep into the pristine nature and abundant wilderness found in Alaska.

You Might Zip Through TSA Faster If Your Passport Has This Small Camera Symbol On It

Starting back in 2006, you may have noticed a new camera-like icon appear on the front of your passport. That's when the United States started implementing biometric passports, also known as e-Passports. The first country to use them was Malaysia in 1998, with other countries following suit in the years that followed. These handy little booklets, which are becoming easier for people to obtain for travel, still otherwise functioned the same way as any passport you'd had before, but now they contain a microchip that security personnel at airports can read.



These microchips include information like your name and birthday, but, even more specifically, the biometric passport also has data to accurately identify you like your fingerprints and retinal scans. According to the State Department, implementing these types of passports was a safety measure, but their existence is still not a reason to get rid of your old passports, even if they aren't biometric.

"The use of biometrics is important for U.S. national security," the U.S. State Department says. "Fingerprints of a visa holder are compared with similarly collected fingerprints at all U.S. ports of entry. The use of fingerprints has many benefits. We reduce the use of stolen and counterfeit visas. We protect against entry by terrorists and others who pose a security risk." As of this writing, approximately 150 countries around the world use biometric passports.



Crunchy Buttermilk Ranch Onion Rings

No more soggy onion rings! The addition of cornstarch to the coating for these tasty rings helps them maintain an irresistible crispy, crunchy exterior. Both the buttermilk soak and panko breading are spiked with ranch seasoning, so the flavor really stands out. We pair them with a speedy lemon aïoli, but you could also serve them with your favorite condiment. This recipe is easy to double if you're serving a larger crowd; see Cook's Note for keeping them warm and crisp if you're frying multiple batches.

Ingredients:

Quick Lemon Aïoli:

- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon sour cream
- 1 small garlic clove, finely grated
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard

Zest of 1 lemon

1/2 teaspoon fresh lemon juice Freshly ground black pepper

Onion Rings:

Vegetable oil, for deep-frying

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch

Two 1-ounce packets ranch seasoning

Kosher salt


- 2 cups buttermilk
- 4 cups panko breadcrumbs
- 1 tablespoon dried dill
- 1 tablespoon dried parsley

Freshly ground black pepper

1 large yellow onion, peeled and sliced into 1/2 inch-thick rounds and separated into individual rings

Directions:

Special equipment: deep-fry thermometer





- 2 For the onion rings: Heat 3 inches vegetable oil in a large Dutch oven or heavy-bottomed pot over medium-high heat until a deep-fry thermometer registers 350 degrees F. Set a wire rack over a sheet pan.
- 3 Whisk the flour, cornstarch, 1 packet of Ranch seasoning and 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt together in a large bowl. In a separate large bowl, whisk together the buttermilk and remaining packet Ranch seasoning. In a wide shallow bowl or pan, combine the panko with the dried dill, dried parsley, 1 teaspoon salt and a few grinds of black pepper.
- 4 Working in batches, thoroughly dredge the onion rings in the flour mixture, then dip them into the buttermilk mixture. Remove the onion rings from the buttermilk mixture, letting any excess drip back into the bowl, then transfer to the panko mixture and use a dry hand to help adhere the breadcrumbs to the rings. Move the coated onion rings to a large plate or sheet pan as you coat the remaining batches.
- Working in two to three batches, carefully place the dredged onion rings into the hot oil and fry until golden brown, 2 to 2 1/2 minutes. Remove to the wire rack to drain and season with kosher salt.
- 6 Serve hot with the lemon aïoli.

Disney Reveals Name and Details of Newest Disney Cruise Line Ship

Disney Cruise Line has officially revealed the name of its newest ship—Disney Destiny.

The ship, currently under construction at the Meyer Werft shipyard in Germany, is scheduled to join the Disney fleet sometime in 2025. It will be a sister ship to Disney Wish, which debuted in 2022, and Disney Treasure, which will join the Disney fleet later this year.


As opposed to Wish and Treasure, the new Disney Destiny will be themed for "Heroes and Villains." According to this week's announcement, the Disney team took inspiration from some iconic Disney classics that pitted heroes against villains including stories "The Lion King," "Hercules" and "One Hundred and One Dalmatians." Guests can expect to see all those stories, and more, incorporated into the design of Disney Destiny.

Destiny will be the third ship in the cruise line's Wish class, joining those two other sister ships, Wish and Treasure. Disney is also in the process of launching Disney Adventure, the first ship in its Global class that will be its largest ever (about 6,000 capacity) and will homeport in Singapore.

All those ships are part of a massive expansion for Disney Cruise Line, the biggest in its history, that started with the post-COVID launch of Wish. Outside of the ships, the expansion also includes Disney's new island destination in The Bahamas, Disney Lookout Cay at Lighthouse Point.
